
Rev. Craig Schneider, MDiv, BCC

The term 'ministry' truly defines Craig Schneider. He is a United Methodist pastor and a Board Certified Chaplain with over 25 years of ministry including serving as a spiritual educator. Currently, he serves as the Spiritual Care Division Manager at Good Samaritan Hospital in Dayton, Ohio where he oversees the Pastoral Care Department and the GSH Health Ministries Program. He also works in the areas of patient rights and organizational ethics, end-of-life issues, human subject clinical trials, patient education materials development, and provides spirituality groups for mental health patients.
