1. NATIONAL INITIATIVES

- a. American Nurses Association –HMA is again working with ANA for revision of the Faith Community Nursing Scope and Standards of Practice. The revised and published Nursing Scope and Standards, 3rd Edition (2015) serves as the basis for all ANA-recognized specialty nursing organizations to update and revise their Scope and Standards of Practice. Here is a recap of the work done in 2015:
 - i. The work group had 3 conference calls for a total of 4.5 hours.
 - ii. In addition, there were additional conference calls and work of the sub-groups totaling approximately 4 hours.
 - iii. The editor (HMA Member Aly Breisch) contributed 12 additional hours for editorial work and conference calls with ANA, individual work group members, and Marsha Fowler, Ethics consultant.

- **b. ANCC** Certification through Portfolio for Faith Community Nurses
 - i. The certification process, which became available in August 2014, continues and FCN's who achieve certification are asked to notify HMA that they have achieved this recognition. ANA does not disclose this information to HMA. 10 HMA members reported achieving board certification in 2015.
 - ii. FCNs who have achieved their certification have an option to apply to the HMA FCN Society as an additional means of promoting and recognizing their achievement. This society was established in late 2015.
