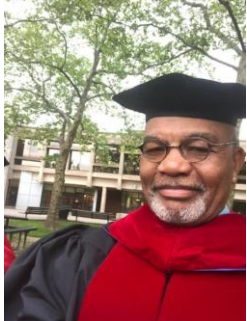


Rev. Dr. William E. Coleman Jr.
